TRANSPORT

Immediately increase evening and Sunday local bus services

Improve bus information, as the No. 281 has done with some success

Integrate (and increase) all public transport eg. Combine access for bus and rail

Council tax reduction for non car users

Introduce local road tax

Car pooling and car sharing should be subsidised and encouraged

Provide job and housing opportunities to enable walking to and from work

TWBC employees to be incentivised to use public transport/cycle
